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#### **Narrative Questions**

Clergy, Vestry and Staff are encouraged to participate in answering these questions.

1. What were the primary opportunities, innovations and challenges in conducting worship during the pandemic? What did you learn?

Initially, the challenges were the abrupt cancellation of in-person worship, in conjunction with the departure of the Priest, and the evolving understanding of the virus, as well as the ever-changing directives and guidance for return to gathering. Additional challenges were responding to and adapting worship, ministries, fellowship, meetings, and all our activities, to an online presence with few technology resources and a limited number of persons with the needed skillsets and enthusiasm for tackling the technology. COVID also has created challenges for the transition process, and we must consider our response to the pandemic to be a critical evaluation for future clergy calls.

The parish has managed to address these challenges in innovative and creative ways to use available technology to maintain worship and opportunities for parish involvement, including daily online Evening Prayer and Compline; a pre-recorded Sunday liturgy that includes our beloved musicians, and is available on our website, facebook, and a new YouTube channel; Zoom Coffee Hour; new electronic communications initiatives and upgrading of our website; using our outdoor spaces for meetings and new ways to gather, including a Drive Through Blessing of the Animals and Ashes to Go.

COVID forced us to recognize that the church is not a building, but a community that needs refreshment and hope through connection. And, while we couldn't do everything the way it had been done, we could find ways to do things, focusing on using the blessings and talent that we have. However, doing all the things we're doing is exhausting and it is stressing the resources and people we have, including our budget.

2. What are the primary opportunities and challenges your church is facing as it plans for the future?

COVID has brought to the forefront challenges that we need to face, and should have been facing, including: long term financial stability, with dwindling financial support and stewardship; aging and declining population; the demands of 'hybrid' worship and maintaining connections in a hybrid community; the loss of the weekly rhythm of Sunday morning; leadership development; mission and vision; understanding the changes in our community around us and how we can be a changing church in a changing world. We need to face that returning to in-person worship will not be a return to the church of 2019.

Identifying challenges is the first step toward owning and acting upon them and seeing them, not as losses or failures, but as opportunities to make us stronger and healthier in the long term.

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- 3. What three things have changed the most in how the church conducts its ministry?
  - 1. Understanding how to do socially-distanced ministry to the parish and the community, and the skills and resources needed to address new ways to fulfill and communicate our mission. We're still exploring how to welcome and reach "virtual" students and how to address food insecurity.
  - 2. Finding the resources, the talent, the skills, and the systems to envision new ways to do ministry for some members of a congregation who are not familiar or comfortable with using technology, and some of whom would prefer to do things as they've always been done.
  - 3. Planning for the future and developing new leadership when the "new normal" seems to be a moving target, and facing that "to everything there is a season" and some things may not be possible in the future.
